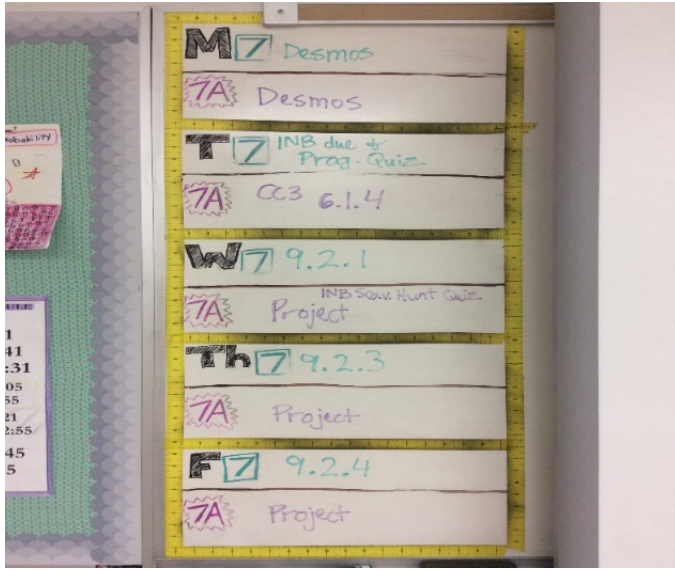

Beginning Tuesday, April 16th, students in Kliever's class will study living Native American authors through a three-day lecture and four-week literature circles. Authors studied in lecture will be Tommy Orange (Tuesday), Sherman Alexie (Wednesday), and Kamiah Koch (Thursday). Students will choose which book they want to read on Friday. Literature circles will run from April 22- May 10. Supplemental materials will be provided throughout literature circles as questions arise. Authors for the literature circles are Dimaline, Erdrich, Alexie, Smith, Taylor, Roanhorse, and Gansworth. Students will write on Fridays a weekly reflection about their reading and group work.

Read180 (6th, 7th, and 8th):

The focus this term will be on descriptive writing, grammar, and mechanics (for example: beginning a sentence with a capital letter, ending punctuation, no random capital letters in the middle of words). As in previous terms, the first 15-20 minutes will be dedicated to student choice reading. Your students may borrow books from me or bring a title from home to read. Following that time, students will work on responding to writing prompts or revising previous days work. Two days a week students will work on the Read180 computer program beginning with Lexile level measurements and phonics testing then progress to on-line reading and comprehension quizzes.
