**PRINCIPLE REPORT** – Morley

- a) Richard Long taking the position of David Chinburg. Richard is from SEHS and has worked with the district to keep and maintain music programs. He is a Bassoonist in the Symphony. There will now be a .4 position open at SEHS to replace Richard.
- b) French Position update. Catherine Wiebe's position is being kept.
- c) Karen Alavi – Library and IMC Aide, was assigned to RMS and will do lunch duty in cafeteria.
- d) Walt is leaving to take a position at North High School. He has been with Roosevelt off and on for about 18 years.

**JUAN REPORT-**

Roosevelt is trying to finish the year off strong and is encouraging students to keep up the good behavior.

**1) Grants**

- a) Morley recommends - \$5000 from the House basket/Staffle Raffle sale go to .83 position for Sami Abbit. This could help add a class.
- b) Site Counsel – Approved \$10,000 for computers in the computer lab. COWS don't always work. They lease now due to how fast computers get outdated.

- c) Juan Reports on Staff Conversation – Staff is talking about taking the \$5000 from the House basket/Staffle Raffle sale and not breaking it up into individual teacher request for classroom needs. They would like to use it all to help keep Walt’s position.

Juan reports that Walt has one more year before he retires. Staff would like to see Walt stay at Roosevelt for his last year. To fund his position would take a donation of at least \$6000 from businesses across the street from Roosevelt to make up for the cost of a crossing guard at lunch. It would take the \$5000 Grant money. But we would need more. 7 Hours are needed to make it work, which works out to be at least another \$7620. Walt would like to stay.

Having kids go over to lunch does not close the achievement gap, so issues of spending are important to look at. Maybe this money could provide another writing class.

Eric reports that we try to cut classified and encourage more teaching hours.

Morley reports that we need full time employees instead of a few part timers because Roosevelt has “Houses” that need full time employees to work.

**PAR asked the question – What do we vote on?**

It was decided that PAR could answer the question – Can staff use the \$5000 grant money how they would like?

PAR would like any additional request of PAR funds that go to staffing, be presented to PAR by Administration.
